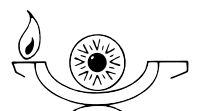

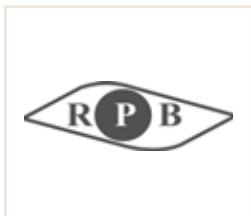

AMERICAN SOCIETY OF CATARACT AND REFRACTIVE SURGERY (ASCRS)

The American Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgery works to advance the art and science of anterior segment ophthalmic surgery through education in medical and surgical treatment of anterior segment eye disease, the development of practice management tools, and by working with patients, government, and the medical community to promote the delivery of quality eye care.

Each year, ASCRS hosts the largest subspecialty meeting in ophthalmology, bringing together more than 4,000 anterior segment surgeons from around the world. The 4-day meeting features paper sessions, symposia, instructional courses, films, posters, didactic wet labs, and advanced education for glaucoma, cornea, cataract and refractive surgery. ASCRS provides an excellent opportunity for residents and fellows to learn both fundamental skills and leading edge techniques.

Beyond its many clinical offerings, the ASCRS Annual Meeting also includes a full half-day program developed specifically for the young ophthalmologist. The program focuses on important practice aspects and provides valuable insight for those beginning a career in ophthalmology.

Registration for the ASCRS/ASOA Symposium and Congress, along with Cornea Day and Glaucoma Day, is free for US residents and fellows.



FIGHT FOR SIGHT

Since 1946, Fight For Sight has supported and inspired eye and vision research by funding promising scientists early in their careers. Application deadline for all grants is FEBRUARY 1. Please visit www.fightforsight.org to apply.

SUMMER STUDENT FELLOWSHIPS:

Summer Student Fellowships are available to undergraduates, graduate and medical students interested in pursuing ophthalmology related clinical or basic research. For most students, this is their first exposure to eye or vision research and the experience has resulted in many students choosing academic ophthalmology and/or eye research as a full-time career. Awards of \$2,100 are given for 2-3 months of full-time research, usually during June to August.

POSTDOCTORAL AWARDS:

Post-Doctoral Awards support individuals with a doctorate (PhD, DrPH, MD, OD or DVM) who are interested in academic careers in basic or clinical research in ophthalmology, vision or related sciences. This funding is intended to offer those interested in an academic career the opportunity to spend a year engaged in vision and eye research under the supervision of a senior scientist/clinician mentor. Residents and clinical fellows are required to spend sufficient time on the funded research project to carry out the proposed objectives while basic researchers are expected to work full-time. One year grants of \$20,000 are awarded for start dates between July 1 and September 1.

GRANTS-IN-AID:

Grants-in-Aid (GIA) are intended to fund pilot projects and generate preliminary results for investigators who have limited or no other research funding. GIA are awarded to junior faculty members who have received their first faculty or research appointment within the previous three years and who are developing their independent scientific skills. A majority of recipients go on to successfully compete for larger, multi-year awards from the NIH or other governmental and private sources utilizing data generated by FFS funded projects. Support may only be used for equipment, consumable supplies or technical staff salary devoted to the specific research project. One year awards of \$20,000 are provided for start dates between July 1 and September 1.

History of AUPO

The Association of University Professors of Ophthalmology (AUPO) was founded in 1965 by several leaders in academic ophthalmology as an organization dedicated to research and education. The mission of AUPO is to serve, strengthen, and represent departments of ophthalmology; to provide support, information, and leadership opportunities to department chairs, program directors, and other faculty members; to promote excellence in ophthalmic education; to foster vision research and to promote ethical practice and excellence in eye care in order to ensure the best possible vision for the public. As such, AUPO is the voice of academic ophthalmology.

Initially including only chairs of ophthalmology divisions or departments in medical schools, the membership was later enlarged to include members who are chairs or co-chairs of departments or divisions of ophthalmology in any institutions that sponsor accredited ophthalmology residency training programs. A category of associate membership was established for residency program directors of accredited residency training programs in ophthalmology who do not chair their department or division. Canadian chairs and their residency program directors became eligible for membership in 1996. In 2006 and 2009 respectively, research directors and medical student educators in departments or divisions of ophthalmology in medical schools or other institutions sponsoring accredited ophthalmology residency training programs, became eligible for associate membership.

Special acknowledgement is due to the continuing support that has been provided by Research to Prevent Blindness (RPB) since the creation of AUPO in 1965. In addition to a very generous unrestricted donation and the support of the AUPO/RPB Resident and Fellow Research Forum, RPB joined with AUPO to match the donation of Bernard Becker, MD, initiating the Physician-Scientist Award, which was awarded in 2001 and 2006. Without the active participation by RPB since our founding, AUPO certainly would not have reached its current level of importance.

The Straatsma Award for Excellence in Resident Education was established in 2002 by AUPO and the American Academy of Ophthalmology. Program Directors have been recognized for this award each year since its inception.

The AUPO Fellowship Compliance Committee (FCC) was created in 2005 to provide training requirements for ophthalmology fellowships. It offers educational standards, protection of the public, institutions, and trainees, accountability and enforcement. To date, six ophthalmic subspecialties, supported by eight ophthalmic subspecialty societies, voluntarily participate in the compliance program. Its goals are accomplished by the following objectives: 1) Create standards for the participating subspecialties in establishing program requirements. 2) Define criteria for each participating subspecialty through the action of its own supporting organization(s), constituting standards for fellowship training including curriculum, research and clinical experience. 3) Determine initial compliance of individual fellowship programs through an application process. 4) Monitor compliance of individual fellowship programs with their subspecialty society's program requirements. 5) Monitor compliant programs on a regular review basis to assure that they remain in compliance. 6) Make compliance status publicly available so that fellowship applicants may use this information in their decision, likewise mentors will have compliance status available when advising residents on fellowship.

Straatsma Award

AUPO/AAO STRAATSMA AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN RESIDENT EDUCATION

Thomas A. Oetting, MD

Thomas Oetting, MD is the Program Director for the Ophthalmology Residency Program and Professor of Clinical Ophthalmology at the University of Iowa, Iowa City and the Chief of the VA Eye Service, Veterans Affairs Medical Center, Iowa City.

Dr. Oetting wishes to thank AAO/AUPO for the honor of being associated with Dr. Straatsma, who has been an inspiration to all in ophthalmic education. He accepts this award on behalf of the program at the University of Iowa and the dedicated faculty and staff who do not waiver in their support of resident education. In particular, Dr. Oetting would like to thank program coordinator Laura Pitlick, a compassionate leader with amazing organizational skills. Dr. Oetting feels fortunate to be able to work with the brilliant, hard working residents at Iowa.

Dr. Oetting became Residency Director in 2006 when Keith Carter took on the role of Chairman. He feels fortunate for the active mentorship of Dr. Carter as well as the guidance and leadership of Andrew Lee. Dr. Oetting credits these two great mentors as he learned the ropes of being a program director and feels that their mentorship allowed him to move beyond the basics to strive for excellence in resident education.

Dr. Oetting's great interest is in surgical education. His goal has been to decrease the risk to patients as residents enter

their surgical career and to increase resident competence at the end of the program through enhancements in surgical training. Dr. Gina Rogers, Dr. Oetting, and others recently published a summary of the downstream impact that the enhanced surgical education at Iowa has had on patient safety. Dr. Rogers reported that the enhanced surgical curriculum in the first and second year decreased the sentinel complications of the third-year residents. Dr. Oetting and Dr. Emily Greenlee developed a structured wet lab program that first-year residents use to learn the basic skills for ophthalmic surgery. Dr. Oetting and Dr. Chris Watts recently presented data demonstrating some benefit with simulation in the very early learning curve in residents at Iowa.

Dr. Oetting is also interested in using Web-based resources for education. Dr. Andrew Doan, Dr. Oetting and others founded EyeRounds.org (www.eyerounds.org) to showcase interesting cases and tutorials from residents at Iowa. In addition Dr. Oetting and his son Drew Oetting developed [facebook.com/cataract.surgery](https://www.facebook.com/cataract.surgery) as a virtual forum for interesting cases. This site has been a great way to learn and has essentially extended the Iowa faculty into the thousands as experienced surgeons from all over the world share tips.

Dr. Oetting looks forward to continuing to shepherd innovations in ophthalmic education with his colleagues, and leading talented residents as they pass through Iowa City.

Derick Garey Holt, MD, PhD

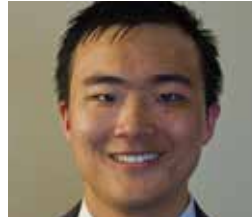
I was raised in Price, a small town in eastern Utah. I acquired a love for learning at an early age, and my interest in medicine stemmed initially from an interest in science. I was introduced to basic science research as an undergraduate, during which time I worked with Dr. Linda Kelley and Dr. Charles Parker studying erythropoiesis. This work prepared me well for my subsequent training in the dual MD/PhD program at the University of Utah. As a graduate student, I was fortunate to work with Dr. Bradley Cairns in the fields of epigenetics and genomics. While in medical school, I worked closely with Dr. Robert Hoffman, chief of pediatric ophthalmology at the Moran Eye Center. He captured my interest in the field of ophthalmology and has been a key mentor throughout medical school and residency. As a senior in medical school, I began work with Dr. Balamurali Ambati, an amazing physician scientist. Our work has focused on uncovering the molecular mechanisms that regulate corneal avascularity. I

am currently a PGY4 ophthalmology resident at the University of Utah with plans to complete a pediatric ophthalmology fellowship and pursue a career as a physician scientist in academic ophthalmology.



Jared E. Knickelbein, MD, PhD

Jared E. Knickelbein, MD, PhD is currently a resident at the UPMC Eye Center in Pittsburgh. He completed the Medical Scientist Training Program at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine and his PhD thesis, entitled Noncytotoxic lytic granule-mediated maintenance of herpes simplex virus type 1 (HSV-1) neuronal latency, in the ocular immunology laboratory of Dr. Robert L. Hendricks. His current research interests involve the mechanisms of corneal graft failure in the setting of previous ocular HSV-1 infection as well as antigen-presenting cell phenotype and function within naïve and inflamed corneas. He plans to pursue fellowship training in Cornea and Uveitis following completion of residency.



Aaron Lee, MD

Aaron Y. Lee graduated magna cum laude from Harvard University with a BA in Biochemistry. He then received his MD and Masters of Science in Clinical Investigations from Washington University in St Louis and is currently a third year ophthalmology resident at Washington University in St Louis. Aaron's research projects during residency have included building bioinformatics tools for handling large datasets, deep sequencing of the transcriptome and microRNA of aging murine macrophages, automating advanced statistical methods such as Monte Carlo Permutation Tests for characterizing complex microbiomes, and exploring pharmacogenetic explanations for the dichotomous treatment response in exudative AMD. In the future, he wishes to continue to apply his strong background in computer science and biostatistics and find new ways to leverage ever increasing computational capacities to solve difficult bioinformatics problems. Next year, he will be

completing a Medical Retina Fellowship at Moorfields Eye Hospital. Afterwards, he hopes to join an academic institution where he can contribute to teaching and continue to explore the intersection of computer science and ophthalmology.



Yannis M. Paulus, MD

Yannis Paulus, MD, is an ophthalmology chief resident at Stanford University Department of Ophthalmology. He is committed to becoming an academic vitreoretinal surgeon with a particular interest in applying physics, bioengineering, and mathematical modeling to develop novel retinal imaging systems and therapeutic techniques and technologies, including laser therapies, surgical techniques, and molecular imaging. He plans to practice at an academic medical center where he would participate in basic science and translational research, teach trainees, and care for patients. He completed a transitional year internship at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer

Center, medical school at Stanford University with a scholarly concentration in bioengineering, and undergraduate at Harvard University in chemistry and physics.

Dr. Paulus has co-developed a novel, inexpensive system for providing tele-ultrasound, co-founded an ophthalmic imaging company, and investigates pattern scanning laser photocoagulation, laser-tissue interactions, and restorative retinal laser therapy. He has received several entrepreneurship awards, published more than 30 peer-reviewed publications, given more than 10 oral scientific conference presentations, and published more than 30 research conference abstracts. He has served as a reviewer for 5 journals and is a leader of his professional community, including being President of the Hellenic American Professional Society of California.

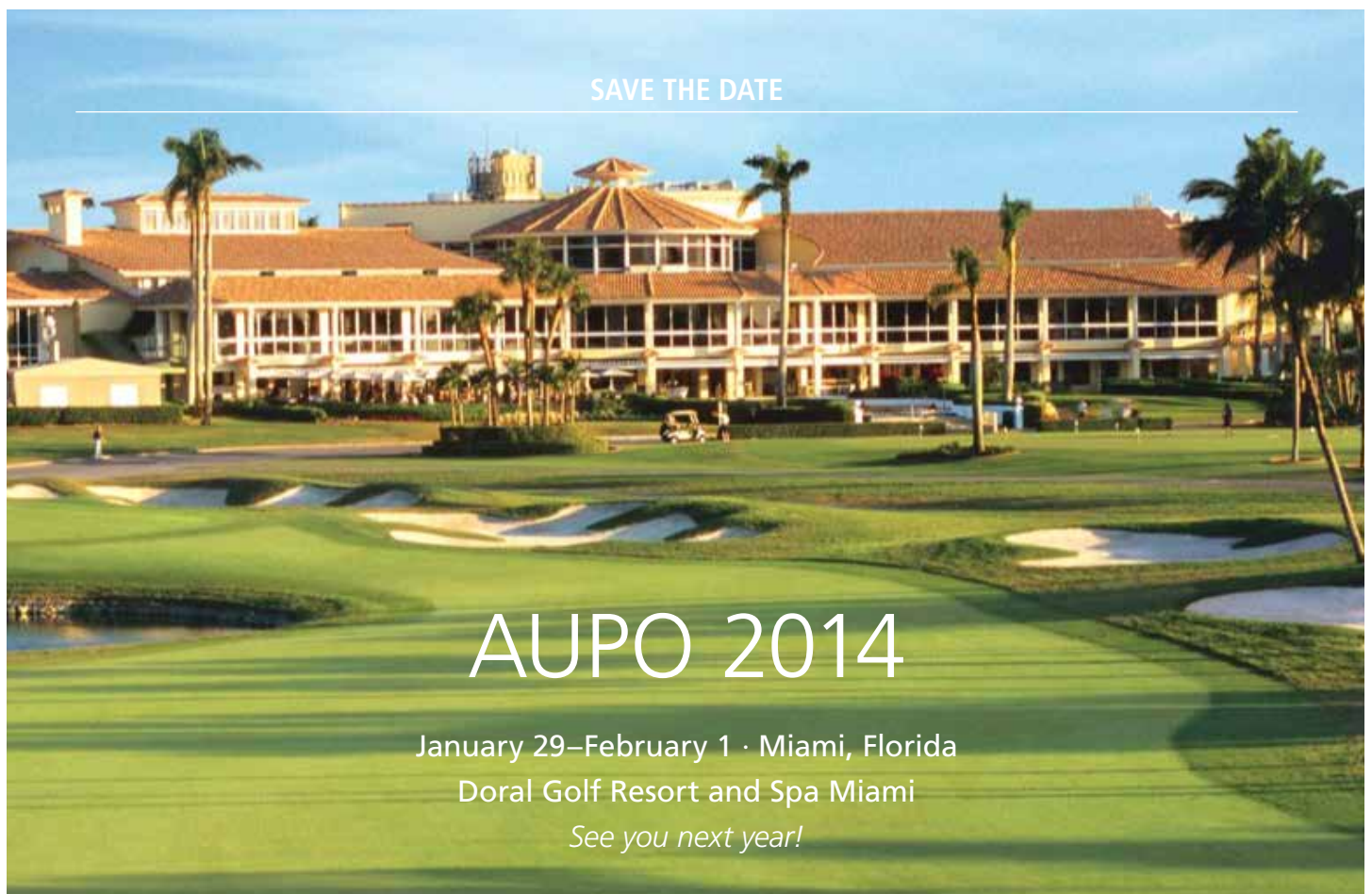

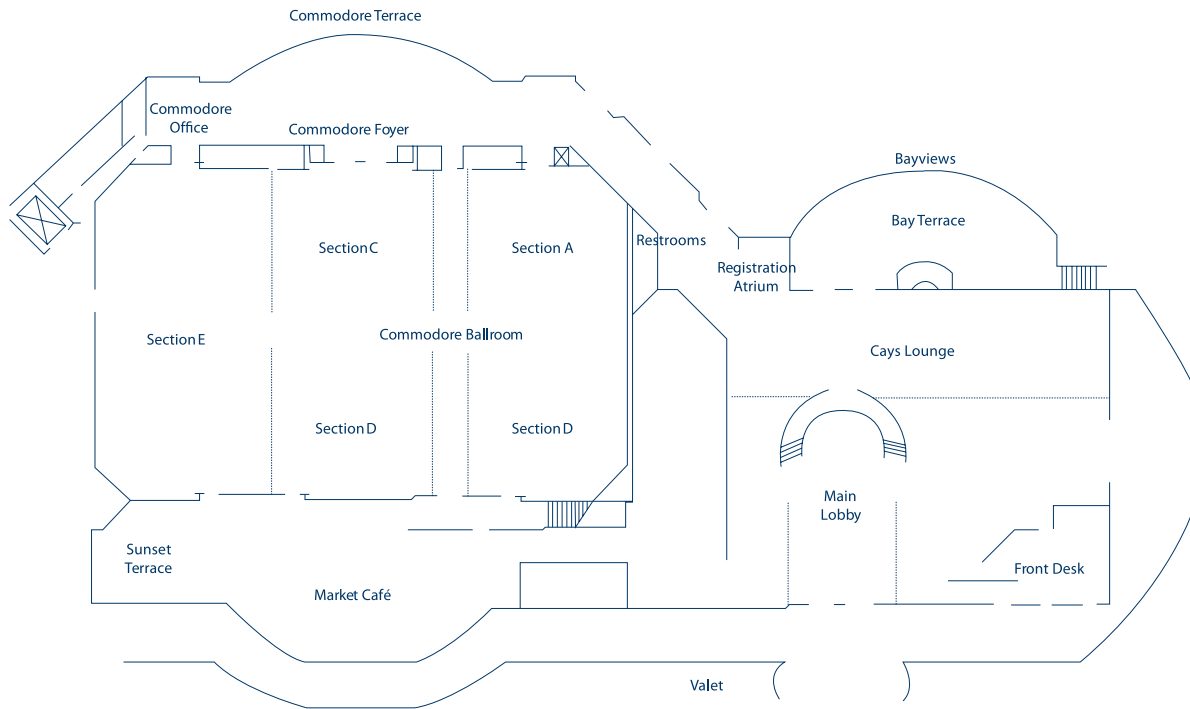

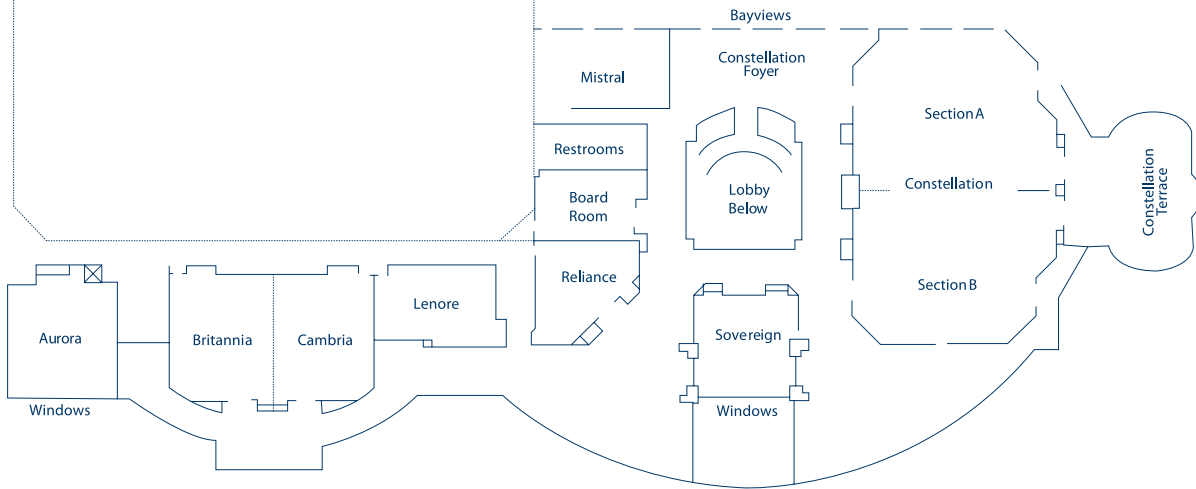
